

2016 Report from Executive Director, Fred Bauermeister

When I reflect on the 45 years the Free Clinic of Simi Valley has been serving the community, I think about the time passed in terms of generations — groups of people that worked together in the unified purpose of helping people in need. The make-up of the volunteers has changed over time, as is true for the people we've served. Back in the 70's it was primarily teenagers. Teenagers were our patients and teenagers were the volunteers. Over time our patients included young adults and some older adults, and the staff aged a little as well. We began to see people with more complicated medical problems and the staff needed to be more sophisticated.

Today, our patients are older and in greater need of care. In 2016 patient visits for those 45 & Over grew a whopping 53%. Our current volunteers range in age from high schoolers, like those that come from Simi Valley High School 's Health Occupation Students of America Program, to retirees such as Dr. Shilling and Dr. Kashinski. These different generations of volunteers wouldn't necessarily know each other outside of the Clinic, but they come together in this setting with a common goal — a commitment to helping others in need. That commitment has been greatly appreciated by the community, as much or more so now than in years past.

On the cover of this year's Annual Report is a tree filled with thumbprints of some of the people that make the Free Clinic possible: people from service clubs like Rotary and Kiwanis, people from our partners like Adventist Health and Kaiser Permanente, our many volunteers from all four of our services as well as our Board of Directors, and some of our funders like Swift Memorial Foundation. If everyone who has supported the Clinic were able to contribute a thumbprint, we would need a much larger tree!

After 45 years of continuous service our roots run deep into the community and our services have touched countless people. Our "branches" continue to

reach out, including the Senior Center where our volunteer therapists run group counseling services, into assisted living facilities, where our dental hygienist treats the home bound. Our mission to serve the underserved remains unchanged, and we continue to grow and evolve to meet the ever-

increasing needs around us. We look forward with excitement to the what the next 45 years will bring!

2016 Highlights

Through the efforts of over 160 volunteers, the Free Clinic had over 14,700 client contacts with almost 4,000 people in 2016. The Clinic remains extremely efficient, delivering these increased services at a cost of \$25.68 per contact.

In 2016, medical, dental, counseling and legal professionals generously donated almost 4,500 hours of service that is equivalent to \$664,224.

Other Highlights:

- On March 1st, the Free Clinic celebrated its 45th Anniversary of providing service to the community of Simi Valley.
- Non-profit art education organization, Art Trek, Inc., hosted a fundraiser for the Free Clinic generating a \$3,000 donation. The event proved to be a very fun outing for staff, volunteers and supporters.



 In April, Kieu Hoang of RAAS Nutritionals and Miss World 2015 Mireia Lalaguna Royo visited the Free Clinic and with representatives of the Kiwanis Club and generously donated \$20,000.



 In June, the Clinic celebrated the graduation of 2015/2016 Kaiser Permanente Family Resident Physicians: Abe Malkin, Jasmine Mosely, Mark Novak, Yogi Pate, Tung Tran and Heather Washington. Since 2007, over 53 physicians have received training at the Free Clinic through this program.

- Also, in June, the Clinic celebrated the graduation of four Ambulatory Care Pharmacy residents: Joel Christian, Liliana Sherman, Carrie Wong and Jessica Wu. To date there have been 25 Ambulatory Pharmacists certified through the training program in partnership with Kaiser Permanente.
- Margaret Seawell and Erin Wharton became licensed Marriage and Family Therapists. To date 53 Clinic interns have become licensed Marriage and Family Therapists.



 Dr. Tracey Young participated in the Simi Valley Library's "Eat, Play, Learn" program teaching young children the benefits of eating nutritional food and exercising through play.

- Kaiser Permanente and the Free Clinic agreed to extend their training relationship for an additional three years.
- The California Wellness Foundation provided a grant to provide an in-home senior dental program.

 On October 15th, the Free Clinic, in partnership with Simi Valley Hospital, hosted its 6th Annual Tooth Fairy 5K /10K Run & Community Health Expo. The event was a smashing success with over 1,000 attendees, over 350 runners, and over 30 health and fitness vendors. The event provided net proceeds of over \$25,000 to fund the Clinic's programs.



- Jill Haney, a local banking executive, joined the Free Clinic Board of Directors.
- Supervisor Peter Foy presented an option to rent the Simi Valley Multi-Services Center, the future home of the Free Clinic.





 With a gift from the Rotary Club of Simi Valley, the Free Clinic received a digital X-Ray network for its dental services. The system allows dentists to more quickly assess patients, and allows the Clinic to no longer use toxic chemicals to develop X-rays.
