In 2022, it was a year of growth for the Free Clinic of Simi Valley. We celebrated 51 years and marked the occasion by honoring and acknowledging our many donors, whose commitment has played a vital role in the continued success and growth of the Free Clinic.

Some key highlights for the year included – the unveiling of the beautiful and vividly colored Donor Wall in the lobby of the Clinic, a new partnership with the West Los Angeles College Dental Hygiene Program, completion of Phase Two of the Donor Plaza, distribution of COVID-19 vaccinations, and the 5th Annual Fredrick Michael Gibson 5K/10K Run and Half Marathon for Depression Awareness.

For the first time since the pandemic, the Clinic resumed children's vaccinations and in-person counseling sessions. There were approximately 8,360 (total visits) people served by clinic services, which included medical, dental, ophthalmology, counseling, and legal services.








COVID-19 Booster Vaccines

In addition to serving as a testing site for COVID-19, the Free Clinic was tapped by the State of California to administer a limited number of COVID-19 vaccinations. A total of 38 boosters were given out to community members.

Congratulations to For the Need Foundation. In March, they held an official Ribbon Cutting Ceremony with supporters and local dignitaries on hand for the celebration. For the Need Foundation is one of seven nonprofit agencies housed in the Multi Services Center wing of the Free Clinic.

For the Need Foundation was founded in 2004 and delivers hope and resources to youth experiencing poverty, homelessness and abuse.



In 2022, the Free Clinic established a partnership with West Los Angeles College Dental Hygiene Program. This collaboration was formed to expand the Clinic's dental program to include preventive dental healthcare. Under the supervision of a professor from the college, students receive training at the Clinic, working on dental patients.
